NOTICE is hereby given that the Loot Committee is prepared to deliver to any holder of a right to a share of the Loot Castle or the proceeds thereof against surrender of such right cattle to the value of £25 subject to the conditions that such cattle shall not be sold or otherwise dealt in within the territory of Mashona or Matabeleland until the whole of the Loot Castle has been disposed of & that any person contravening this condition shall pay to the Loot Committee as damages the sum of £2 per head of cattle sold. NOTICE is hereby given that on the 15th day of August next a dividend of £10 will be paid to each member of the Expedition, who is entitled to a proportion of the proceeds of the sale of cattle captured during the war or to the registered proprietor of such right. The Secretary of the Loot Committee Bulunayo is authorized to register the names of all members entitled to a proportion of these proceeds & of those who have purchased rights to the same. A charge of 4/- is made for registration, & a certificate is issued by the Secretary to the proprietor of the right.
